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Managing the school day

- Develop respectful relationships with all staff and students.

Mobile Phones & Smart devices

- Mobile phones and other smart devices (Smart watches & iPads, and airpods) are **BANNED** from use in the academy – this includes the outside areas.
- In order to continue to safeguard our students, they are permitted to have their phones **switched off and in their bags.**
- In line with our policy, if students are seen on their phones this will be confiscated and parent must collect.



Attendance

- ✓ Attend the academy each day.
- ✓ Be on time. Period 1 starts at 8.40am.
- ✓ Move to and from lessons with purpose

Please Note: Students will very quickly navigate the building and their timetable with ease.



Punctuality



If students arrive late to the academy without a reasonable explanation, they will receive a 15-minute detention at lunchtime that day.

If students are late twice during a week, then they will receive a 75-minute detention.

If students are late to any lessons during the day they will receive a 30-minute detention at the end of the day.

Parents/carers will receive a text to inform them of these sanctions.



Identification

ID badges must be visible at all times, worn on the lanyard.

These will be checked by all members of staff.



We encourage students to be responsible for their lanyards, along with their equipment for learning.



Cashless Catering

You will have received the necessary documentation to set up your cashless payments.

Please note that students who are offered free school meals have their payments preloaded to their card.

It is imperative students have their cards with them in order to purchase foods at break and lunch time.

Lockers

- Lockers will be available for all Year 7 students from September. There will be a first-come, first-served allocation for all other students. So, each year the new Year 7s will all have a locker.
- There will be a **£5 rental cost** which covers the year.
- Students will need to provide their own padlock.

Footwear

Shoes must be all black with black stitching.
Trainers are not permitted.



Uniform

Students are expected to wear their blazers around the academy at all times.

In the summer term, depending on temperature, this dress code will be adjusted.

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Uniform

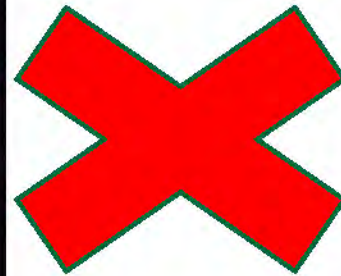
False eyelashes are not permitted.

Energy drinks are banned from the Academy



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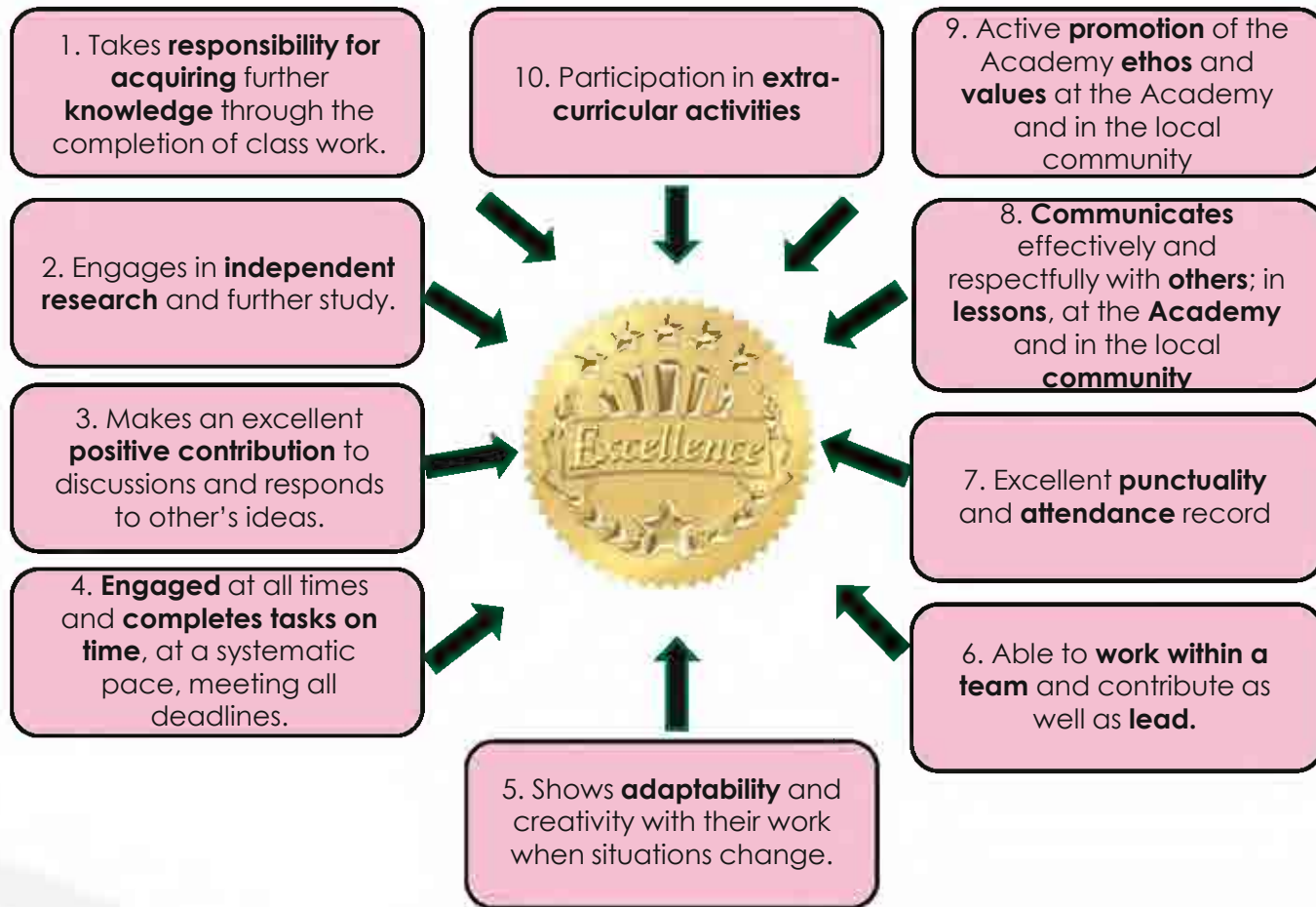




The Excellent Student Award
